Evan and Jean Bergwall

Twenty-eight years ago, a young, reluctant leader accepted the summons of his fellow Trustees and journeyed to Upland—accompanied by his wife, Jean, and two sons—to assume the presidency of Taylor University. It was a role for which Evan and Jean Bergwall were well suited, and they served with distinction for eight years.

Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, their leadership was characterized by keen intellectual and spiritual integrity, distinctives which have remained constant and are today permanently symbolized by the twin pillars of the Rice Bell Tower.

With this dual thrust of intellectual as well as spiritual leadership, Evan and Jean Bergwall brought to the institution's constituencies a renewed confidence in the stability of the University, as evidenced by the tripling of alumni support. During their tenure, an ambitious development program was launched, resulting in the construction of the Morris Hall complex and a 39-unit housing development for married students, as well as the liquidation of the Ayres Alumni Memorial Library debt. Taylor University was removed from the grip of financial crisis, molded and shaped into a vital, growing, academic institution with an active, "whole-person" approach to education.

The Bergwalls were beloved by students and faculty, and their influence extended beyond the campus into the community where they became valued contributors, cultivating strong relationships between "town and gown." They brought with them a background of meritorious ministry in the United Methodist Church, ministry deepened and enhanced in the years following their Taylor service. In all, their lives have borne witness to their commitment to God's Kingdom. Taylor stands where she is today through the efforts of her faithful leaders across the fourteen decades of her life. Dr. and Mrs. Evan Bergwall are prominent in this elite company of presidents and first ladies.
