Among relevant details about an individual that seem to influence how likely a person is to experience poverty, researchers include: education, family composition, race, how rural or urban the community where they live is, what part of the country they live in, criminal background, and medical history.

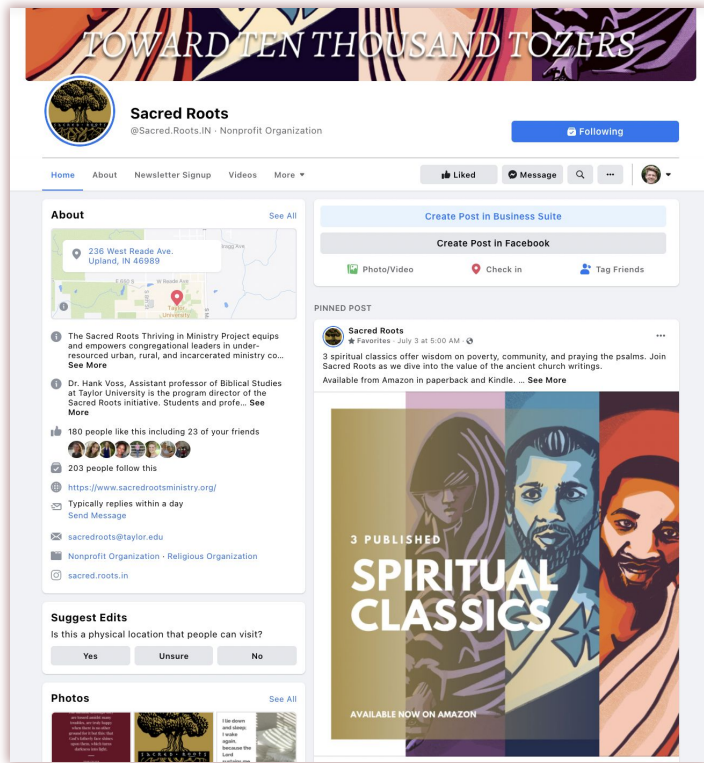

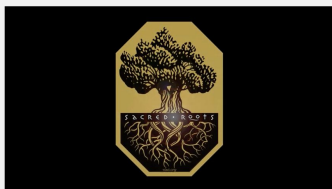

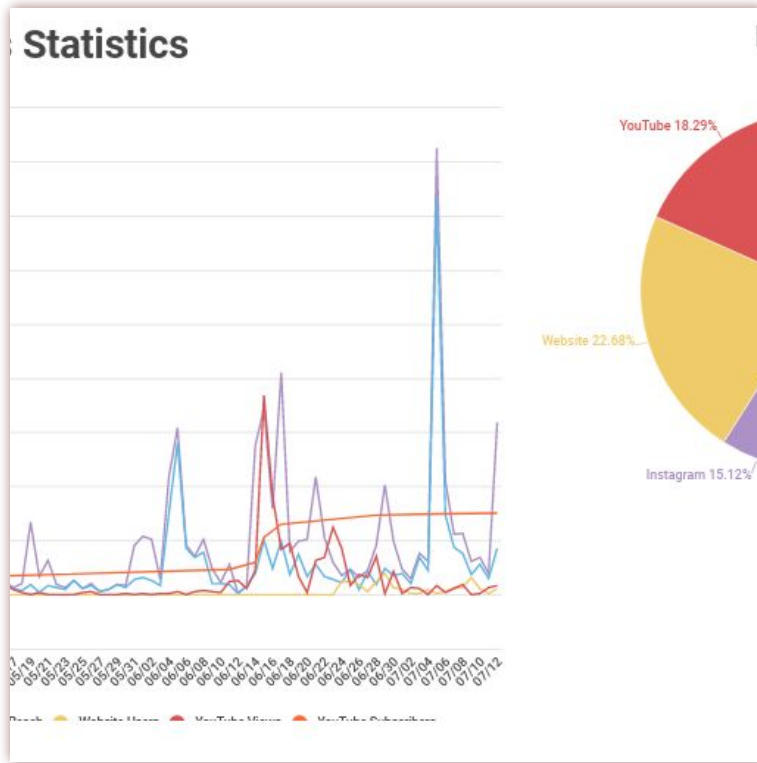
