Divorce Suit

The suit of-Florence A. Pierce against Thomas Pierce for divorce, \$13,500 alimony and \$1,000 attorney fees was filed n the Grant superior court y Similar action, asking similar alimony had been filed a few months ago and was afterward dismissed.

Pierce and Pierce were married Dec. 26 1910, and separated July 8, 1915. They lived on a farm east of the city. The charge of cruel and inhuman treatment made by the wife covers a multitude of allegations. She says her husband was jealous without cause of one Burr Wysong and has made false accusations against the plaintiff. He has committed assault and battery on the plaintiff, threatened to kick her out of bed, and has failed to provide her a living, according to the averments of the plaintiff. The plaintiff's former name was Florence A. Bradley and she asks the court to restore this
