International Day will be celebrated at Taylor University Wednesday, March 2, with guest speakers participating in a series of lectures and other festivities, President B. Joseph Martin has announced.

Highlighting the Day's activities will be an address by N. B. Menon, First Secretary of the Embassy of India in Washington, D.C. Mr. Menon will speak on "The Emerging Role of India in World Affairs."

Mr. Menon was born in Malabar, South India, and was educated at the Allshabad University.

From 1949-51 he was Second Secretary, Embassy of India, The Hague; 1951-54, Second Secretary Indian Military Mission, Berlin; 1954-57, First Secretary, Indian Embassy, Katmandu, Nepal; 1957-59, First Secretary, Embassy of India, Ottawa. At present he is First Secretary of the Indian Embassy, Washington, D.C.

Curtis Gans, National Affairs Vice President of the United States National Student Association, will speak at a Chapel Convocation to be held at 9:30 in Maytag Gymnasium. Mr. Gans is from the University of North Carolina.

He will again speak to the student body at a 3:30 meeting in Shreiner auditorium.

Professor E. Sterl Phinney will be moderator of a panel discussion concerning Latin America which will be conducted at 10:30. Other members of the panel are Curtis Gans, Dr. Walter Oliver, Taylor professor, Dr. Willard H. Smith, chairman of the social science division, Goshen College, and Clarence Stuart, a Taylor student from Panama.

Kan Ori, an instructor in political science and candidate for Ph. D. at Indiana University, will lecture at 1:30 in Shreiner auditorium on "American Federalism and Its Dilemma in Foreign Relations." Ori is a Taylor graduate. From 3:00 to 5:00 p.m., and International Student Exhibit, sponsored by the Taylor International Club, will be staged in Magee-Campbell parlors.

An International Dinner, featuring Chinese, South American and Italian foods will be served at 5:30 in the dinning hall.

The day is planned and sponsored by the Taylor Student Council in recognition of the contributions made to campus life by students from foreign countries and to promote understanding of world affairs.
