In my original proposal of February 15, 1973, the chancellor role was defined as extensive participation in spiritual life activities and counseling with faculty and students. This implies direct involvement with the campus pastor and the counseling center. Off-campus responsibilities and opportunities would include representation in the educational and development organizations of the state and the nation, e.g., Independent Colleges and Universities of Indiana, Associated Colleges of Indiana, Christian College Consortium, North Central Association, and the professional associations of which Taylor is a member. Also included would be continued cultivation of major prospective donors, both individuals and foundations.

Perhaps it would be impractical to attempt more detailed development of the job description before consultation with a president-elect (who may or may not care for a team relationship with a chancellor). However, in my perception of the role, I would add major emphasis on cultivation time with trustees, possibly with associates, and also on representation of Taylor University to the public through speaking and writing.
