MUSIC DIRECTOR - PATRICIA ROBERTSON

Patricia Robertson has served as music director for both the TU Opera Theater and the Mitchell Theatre since 2002; her operatic credits include performances of Magic Flute, Bartered Bride, Marriage for Figaro, La Perichole, Pirates of Penzance, Gondoliers and for the Mitchell Theater the musicals, Adventures of Tom Sawyer, A Christmas Carol and Godspell.

Her directing credits also include productions of Cosi fan tutte and Dido and Aeneas for the Anderson University Opera Theatre. From 1989-1999 she served on the faculty of the Ball State Summer Theatre Festival, a semi-professional repertory company funded by the National Endowment for the Arts; with that company she provided support and direction for such productions as 1776, Bye Bye Birdie, Hello Dolly and The Secret Garden.

A frequent recital performer she has appeared in concert with the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, the Marion Philharmonic and the Muncie Symphony Orchestra. Recital appearances elsewhere include those with the Northwest Bach Festival (Spokane WA), St. Andrew's Cathedral Music Series (Honolulu HI), and Shenandoah Valley Bach Festival (Harrisonburg VA).

ARTISTIC DIRECTOR - TRACY MANNING

Welcome to this production of *Kiss Me, Kate*. We are delighted you are here.

The music and lyrics for *Kiss Me, Kate* were written by Indiana composer Cole Porter. The story involves the production of a musical version of William Shakespeare's *The Taming of the Shrew* and the conflict on and off-stage between Fred Graham, the show's director, producer, and star, and his leading


lady, his ex-wife Lilli Vanessi.

Kiss Me, Kate was Porter's response to Rodgers and Hammerstein's *Oklahoma!* and other integrated musicals; it was the first show he wrote in which the music and lyrics were firmly connected to the script, and it proved to be his biggest hit and the only one of his shows to run for more than 1,000 performances on Broadway. In 1949, it won the first Tony Award presented for Best Musical. It is a great example of what an intelligent and witty musical comedy can look like and it is the show you will see tonight.

Some might consider Romantic Comedy to be a creation of our generation but Shakespeare and Porter had it locked up before most of us were born. It has been rewarding to talk about the relational issues within the musical with these students, like mutual submission, divorce, reconciliation and forgiveness. It's been good to laugh, talk, create, and work together.

As with any production, the rehearsal period has been fraught with emotional, mental, spiritual, relational, medical, and practical concerns and issues. We live in the midst of our circumstances, but also in the midst of miracle. We have walked through this season of our lives together and invite you to set aside your circumstances for a time and smile with us, laugh with us, play with us. The community we will form together this evening can never be replicated. Together we will have a unique shared experience and we prayfully hope you will feel richer and lighter because of it.

Enjoy our production of this Golden Age Musical Comedy *Kiss Me, Kate,* tell your friends, and come back and see us for *The Cherry Orchard* in February. We will be here, creating to the Glory of God.

"I view theatre as fitting squarely at the focal point of what a liberal arts education is all about. If anything focuses the liberal arts, any single endeavor on campus, it is a production. We enter into other peoples' experiences and expand our horizons because we have been able to enter other peoples' worlds, look through their eyes, go places, and experience things vicariously that are outside of our scope of normal experience.
