Coach Marion Crawley of

Lafayette and Coach Don Odle of Taylor University have announced the annual Junior Basketball Camp, which will be held on the campus of Taylor University this summer during the first four weeks of August.

Last year 360 boys enrolled in the camp and received instruction in the fundamentals of Indiana High School basketball from some of the outstanding coaches in the state.

This year's camp will again include Joe Platt from the Kokomo Wildcats and Coach John Longfellow from Muncie Central's undefeated powerhouse. Woody Weir, former coach of Marion, also has been named to the staff.

Any boy who has not entered high school is eligible for the camp. A citizenship hour will be conducted each day. Featured during these periods will be talks by guest speakers including Dr. Elmer Nussbaum, atomic scientist; Bob Davenport, former All-American full back from UCLA, now Taylor's football coach; a judge and a state trooper. The boys will live at the college dormitory and eat at the college's new dining hall. Other features of the program will be music, swimming, tennis, and a talent show.

Coach Marion Crawley's team recently won their eighteenth consecutive sectional tournament, and again the teams from Northern Indiana must pass by his highly touted broncos before entering the state finals. Coach Don Odle's team this season won 18 games and lost 10. During part of the camping period, Odle plans to be in the Orient helping to train Nationalist China's Olympic Team, which he has been asked to coach.

College trained counselors will also serve on the staff to supervise the campers.
