

2002 DISTINGUISHED PROFESSOR

Dr. William A. Heth was recognized during the May 13th Honors Chapel as the 2002 Distinguished Professor of the Year. He received his doctorate from Dallas Theological Seminary and has taught at Taylor since 1987. He is a professor of New Testament and Greek. Dr. Heth loves what he does and cares about his students.
