Upland, Indiana - - - The Taylor Civic Symphony will stage a concert Sunday, March 20, at 3:30 p.m., in the Marion High School Auditorium, Dr. B. Joseph Martin has announced.

Members of the Civic Symphony include Taylor students, residents of Marion and Fairmount, and members of the Muncie, Anderson and Manchester symphonies.

Also featured will be three members of the Taylor music faculty, Mary Young Dean, Betty Kuhlman Pease and Edward Joseph Pease. The program is as follows:

Mrs. Dean, Assistant Professor of Music, teaches piano at the college. For ten years she taught piano at Asbury College and had a private voice studio.

Dr. and Mrs. Pease are both Fulbright scholars, who studied at the University of Freiburg, Germany, prior to joining the Taylor faculty last fall.

Pease has been Assistant Professor of Music at Pan-American College, Texas, and was an assistant band director in the U.S. Air Force for four years. He also has taught music privately for eight years.

Mrs. Pease is a concert violinist and a chamber music performer. She has been Assistant Professor of Violin and Head of the String Department at Mississippi Southern College, first violinist of the Amphion String Quartet and concert master of two symphony orchestras. She has given private instruction for twelve years.

The orchestra is directed by Professor Dale Shepfer, Taylor Band and Orchestra Conductor. He is a graduate of Baldwin Wallace College and Northwestern University, and studied at the Masters School of Conducting under the direction of Pierre Monteaux, former conductor of the Boston and San Francisco symphonies.
