






Novacella Monastery

 700 years later members of this movement founded a discipleship center in 1142.




 The center is still on mission today, 850 years later.





Of the first 31 "Senior Pastors" of Rome ("bishops"), 28 died as martyrs.

As many as 14 of these leaders were buried at the Callixtus catacombs.


















Elizabeth Fry

- Mother of eleven children.
- Recorded as a Minister among the Quakers at age 31 (1811). Preached and evangelized around Europe.
- Began working in prison ministry in 1813.
- Changed the culture, laws, and attitude of the most powerful nation on earth towards prisons and the incarcerated.

- Bunyan's Pilgrim's Progress
- Scougal's Life of God in the Soul of Man
- Howe's On the Holy Spirit
- Baxter's Call to the Unconverted
- Baxter's Saint's Everlasting Rest
- John Newton's Spiritual Autobiography





 - A. Definition #1: Spiritual Classics Provide <u>"Catholic"</u>

 <u>Perspective</u> on Our Generation's Blind Spots
 - 1. We believe in "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic church"
 - 2. Arthur Holder's definition of spiritual classics emphasizes their catholicity
 - The catholicity of spiritual classics helps our own generation to recognize cultural blind spots
 - 4. Western blind spots in 2022


- 3. John Wesley and the Wesleyans
 - The "Christian Library"
 - John Wesley printed a collection of 50
 Spiritual Classics which he called the "Christian Library".
 - b. "We must give special importance to supplying the poor with shorter, cheaper and simpler books than those that have existed up to now..." John Welsey



 - Pastors in this generation are tired
 - The "Great Resignation" and pastoral burnout



"According to surveys conducted last summer by the Hartford Institute for Religion Research at Hartford International University, 37% of clergy had "seriously considered leaving pastoral ministry" at least once during the preceding year, and 67% had thought at least once during that time that it was the hardest year of their ministry experience."

- V. Constructing a Sacred Roots Thrive Plan
 - A. Definitions of "Sacred Roots Study Group" and "Thrive Plan"
 - A Sacred Roots Study Group consists of congregational leaders who are learning together under the guidance of a local mentor, a contemporary mentor, and an historical mentor.
 - A Thrive Plan is the specific, intentional strategy a Sacred Roots Study Group adopts to apprentice together under a master practitioner of life with God (e.g. Augustine, Athanasius, Benedict, Basil).

A drawing of my dream


