METHOD

For each chapter of Dr. Treier's *Introducing Evangelical Theology*, a Power Point presentation was created containing the following: 1) sample teaching objectives for the chapter, organized into the categories of head, heart, hand, habit, and habitat, 2) Dr. Treier's own objectives stated at the beginning of the chapter, 3) the thesis of the chapter, and 4) a slide dedicated to each of Dr. Treier's objectives for the chapter, including a list of vocabulary words.

For select chapters of Anizor, Price, and Voss's *Evangelical Theology*, study guides were created containing the following: 1) the thesis of the chapter, 2) the chapter structure, 3) five learning objectives for the chapter, 4) all tables and charts from the chapter, 5) vocabulary words from the chapter, and 6) recommended reading from the chapter.

BACKGROUND

This project was primarily focused on creating teaching resources for educating students about the context of the larger SRTM project. Using Daniel J. Treier's Introducing Evangelical Theology and Uche Anizor, Robert Price, and Hank Voss's *Evangelical* Theology, Power Point presentations and study guides were created to assist teachers in using these two resources to educate students about the history and current status of evangelical theology.






The orthodox identity of Jesus Christ involves the hypostatic union: in the incarnation the fully divine Son of God has assumed a fully human nature, to serve as the one Mediator of revelation and redemption.

RESULTS

Today's Objectives

Students will be able to explain the meaning of all 33 key terms introduced in the chapter.

Students will be able to recall two creeds and connected Christological frameworks in relation to the major christological heresies.

Students will use their knowledge of the six major christological heresies and the biblical arguments against them to identify and stay within the bounds of sound doctrine. Students will habitually return to the Nicene and

Chalcedonian Creeds for help with thinking well about Jesus as both human and divine.

TREIER'S OBJECTIVES

1. Students will define the key terms introduced in the chapter.

2. Students will list and recognize Alexandrian "Word-flesh" and Antiochene "Word-man" frameworks as well as historical details related to the major christological heresies.

3. Students will describe and compare the major christological heresies.

4. Students will identify and illustrate key biblical arguments for the hypostatic union and against the major christological heresies.




