Charles Colson

Twenty-two years ago, as an aide to President Richard Nixon, Charles W. Colson was known as the White House "hatchet man," a man feared by even the most powerful politicians during his four years of service to Nixon.

In 1973, though, Colson became a Christian and the direction of his life changed dramatically. After seven months of serving time in Alabama's, Maxwell Prison for his association with the Watergate scandal, Colson and three friends launched Prison Fellowship, which has today become the world's largest prison outreach.

Colson is a syndicated columnist and has authored twelve books including *The Body* and *Born Again*, an international bestseller.
