*Our Cabinet has been working hard to make this the best Homecoming ever. We hope all of you are as enthusiastic about this great weekend as we are.*

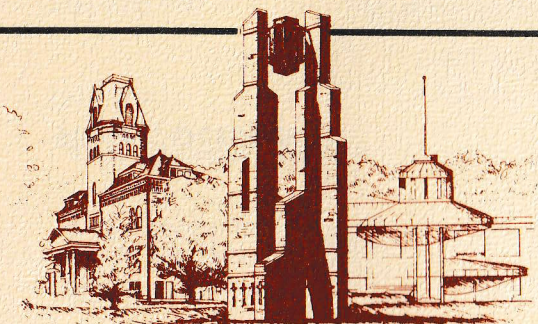

Continuing Education is again cooperating with Alumni Relations to provide you with learning opportunities designed for individual enrichment and acquisition of new knowledge and skill. Join us on Super Friday for one or more of these special mini-courses.

1:00-1:50 p.m. *The Influence of George MacDonald* by David Neuhouser, PhD, Professor of Mathematics  
George MacDonald was an author contemporary with Charles Dickens and Lewis Carroll, of *Alice in Wonderland*. MacDonald wrote over forty novels inspiring such authors as C. S. Lewis, T. S. Eliot, and J. R. R. Tolkien.

2:00-2:50 p.m. *The Olympic Games* by Roger Jenkinson, EdD, Professor of Geography and History  
The beginning and the 1989 games will be discussed and contrasted. Dr. Jenkinson is a delegate to the 1989 Olympic Games Committee.

3:00-3:50 p.m. *Sergeant York* by William Ringenberg, PhD, Professor of History  
The film *Sergeant York* will be shown and discussion will follow. His connection with Taylor University will be one of the items of discussion.

4:00-4:50 p.m. *The B Western's Impact on American Life* by Philip Loy, MA, Professor of Political Science  
The old Saturday matinee provided the opportunity for the good guy to beat the bad guy and ride off into a glorious sunset with head held high. This presentation will offer an opportunity to relive—or to perhaps first experience—those halcyon days of the Old (film-version) West.

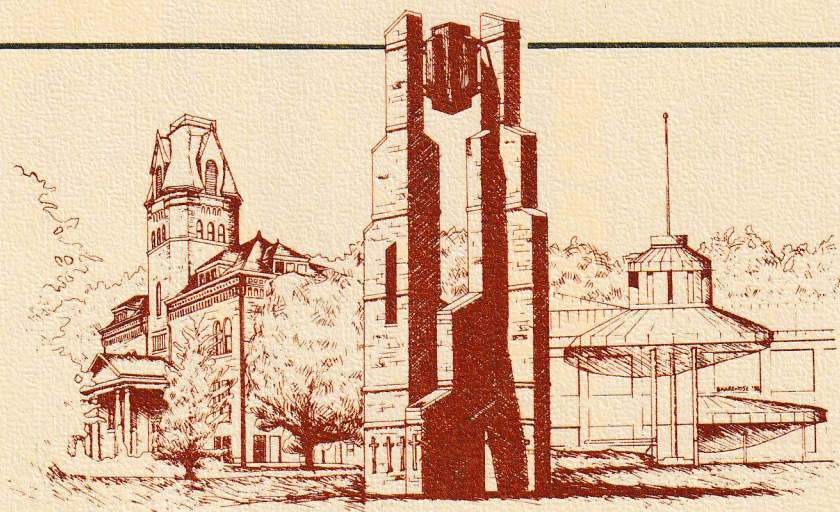
