



Celebrate with us the naming of the science center in honor of our own Dr. Elmer Nussbaum '49, Chairman of the Division of Natural Sciences and Mathematics and Professor of Physics.

Earlier in the Homecoming week, the science department will sponsor a chapel and a three-part symposium at which Dr. Joseph Brain '61, Harvard University, Dr. John Lee '61, University of Texas, and Dr. David Randall '67, University of Kentucky, will be the featured speakers.

On Saturday at 11:30 a.m., science alumni are invited to a luncheon in the Hodson Commons Banquet Room in honor of Dr. Nussbaum.

The celebration will culminate in the Sunday events during which Dr. Walter Randall '38, a distinguished scholar in the field of physiology, will be the morning worship speaker. A reception for the Nussbaums from 1:30 to 3:00 in the afternoon in the Nussbaum Science Center will complete the week's events.



Respected teacher and distinguished nuclear physicist, Dr. Elmer Nussbaum has devoted the past thirty years to serving Christ at his alma mater, Taylor University. After his graduation in 1949, Elmer received the MA degree from Ball State University in 1952 and the PhD from the University of Rochester in 1957. He has been associated with the Oak Ridge Institute for Nuclear Studies (later called the Oak Ridge Associated Universities) since 1960, first as a consultant and then as Senior Scientist. A 1963 assignment with the International Atomic Energy Agency took him to research installations around the world.



Homecoming Chapel speaker, DR. EVAN BERGWALL, JR., is a clinical psychologist practicing near Atlanta, Georgia. In addition, he is an Associate Minister in a large United Methodist church, working in its counseling center with business executives and their relationships to family life. A '64 graduate of Taylor, Evan is the son of former Taylor President, the late Dr. Evan Bergwall, Sr. '39, and Mrs. Jean Bergwall.

Sunday Morning Devotional speaker, DR. MARK COSGROVE, is head of the Taylor Psychology Department and recipient of the Alumni Association's 1980 Distinguished Professor award. Mark is a much-sought-after Bible teacher who successfully integrates psychology and Christianity in the classroom.


