Why did you choose Taylor and your major?

I appreciated the way the professors spoke to the students, I really liked the environment in chapel, and Taylor is a really beautiful campus.

Choosing my major was maybe just as difficult as choosing a school. I changed my major about four times! But I finally decided that PR would be a good major for me because I absolutely love working with people. I also love how versatile it is, and I don't like to be put into a box.

Have you had any internship experiences?

I actually did three internships throughout my time here at Taylor. I did one my sophomore year through Sturtz Public Management Group that lasted a couple of months. I did another one my sophomore year through Thriving Families, Thriving Grant County in Marion, which has extended into a job for the past couple of years. Finally, I did one over this past summer at Mentoring Moms, Inc in Fort Wayne, and I am now part of the Leadership Team there.

I learned so much through these internships, especially from the two that are still a part of my weekly activities. They are incredibly different, one working in community development, and another working with women in crisis. Mostly, I have learned how to be a leader and to take initiative while following Christ.

What are the most important things you've learned in your major classes? Can you give an example of an impactful class?

In my *Cases and Campaigns* class we had the opportunity to do hands-on work for Taylor University. We conducted a case study over the Title IX policies at TU, and afterwards we did a campaign for the university. I loved getting to see the impact of a semester-long project come full circle. It's also something I'm very passionate about.

How has your faith been affected by your Taylor experience?

Coming to Taylor has given me the opportunity to explore my faith and for me to decide what I

believe, especially through my *Historic Christian Belief* class and *Contemporary Christian Belief* class. I never knew there were so many different views or interpretations, so I have loved getting to learn more about what others think, too. That trip was incredibly impactful.

She is incredibly selfless and a great role model. She is kind, but she is also courageous, and she really pushes her students to do their very best.

I feel like I have developed my skills as a professional, and have really grown to learn how to own my abilities and strengths.
