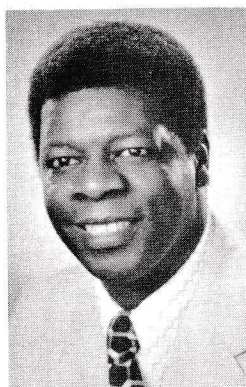

The Reverend Mr. Bell has achieved distinction in recent years as an Associate Evangelist with the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association. He has preached throughout our nation and in many parts of the world, and was Co-chairman of America's first National Negro Evangelistic Leadership Conference. In 1968 he blazed a trail with Spirit-filled crusades in white areas of middle America, and has made a significant contribution to racial unity in the name of Christ. A native of Canada, he is a graduate of Moody Bible Institute and Fuller Theological Seminary, as well as Taylor University. 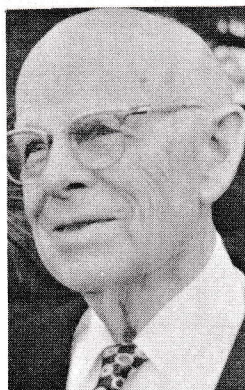

Beulah (Meier '55) Coughenour

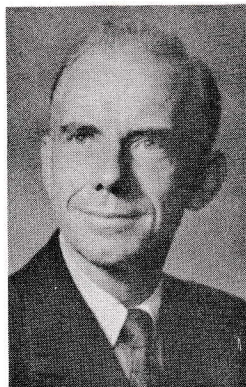
