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
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Taylor Lyric Theatre presents: Working—A

Musical

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The Taylor University Lyric Theatre presents Stephen Schwartz's musical *Working*. Three showings are scheduled: February 5 and 6 at 8 pm, and February 7 at 2 pm. All are in Taylor University's Butz-Carruth Recital Hall, and tickets are \$10.00.

Schwartz is renowned for his musicals which include *Wicked, Pippin, Working* and *Godspell.* For *Working*, first performed in 1977 and updated in 2012, Schwartz drew from the verbatim texts of Studs Terkel's famous 1974 book *Working: People Talk About What They Do All Day and How They Feel About What They Do.* Instead of presenting just one story, *Working* tells the varied stories of relatable people who are working to make a mark as well as to make a living. Through catchy tunes, dynamic dance numbers, and raw text from interviews with actual people—including a trucker, a waitress, a delivery worker, a teacher, a flight attendant, a mill worker, and others—*Working* provides humorous and poignant glimpses into the identity of Americans working in "everyday" jobs. Schwartz assembled an all-star team of songwriters, including James Taylor, Lin-Manuel Miranda, Micki Grant, and Craig Carnelia, to write music in a variety of styles to reflect the diverse characters.

The first full production of a musical in the Smith-Hermanson Music Center coincides with the recent launch of Taylor's BFA Musical Theatre degree, a joint offering of the music and theatre departments. This degree allows students to take advantage of Taylor's programs in music, theatre and dance in order to become Christian artists prepared for the professional musical theatre world.

Taylor alumnus Ryan Maloney, now based in Florida and working full-time in theatre, is scenic designer for *Working*, and alumna Sara Bailey is production manager and costume designer. Taylor

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dance faculty member Kory Browder is choreographer, Dr. Patricia Robertson is music director, and Dr. Conor Angell is stage director.
