






A Word about Our Speaker . . .

The guest speaker for Youth Conference '82 will be Ken Overstreet, the San Diego Area Director of Youth for Christ, Campus Life and Youth Guidance.

Overstreet has been a leader in youth programming for the past 25 years, and all three of his organizations have received national recognition. He also serves as a Vice President of the Media Division for Youth for Christ/USA.

He hosted the national television special, "Is There a Family in the House," and was the associate producer of the television program, "Where Have All the Children Gone." Overstreet also helped create and syndicate the national radio program, "Reality", and is currently working on another television special which deals with major problems which face today's teenagers.

Some of Overstreet's other honors include being elected to the Board of Youth for Christ International, and serving on the President's Commission on Youth. He was also selected as the San Diego "Good Guy of the Year", and honored as one of San Diego's Ten Most Outstanding Young Men in 1976.




