

PREACH MY WORD

"I AIN'T GOING TO PREACH FOR NOBODY!"

n a country church in Northeastern Arkansas during a Sunday School assembly, deacons and church leaders said of a seven-year-old boy, "That boy is going to be a preacher." That boy said in his heart, "I ain't going to preach for nobody!"

Little did I know just how much I meant those words. Thinking as a seven-year-old thinks, I didn't want to be a preacher because church people treated the pastor so badly. I didn't think God would help His preachers deal with church problems.

I continued my participation in Sunday School and received Christ as my personal Savior when I was eleven. At age 13 I felt that I had to make a decision about my life-style. I chose to live my life my way. What a mistake!

I began to live a life of sin. Looking back on those times, I believe I was trying all I could to disqualify myself from God's service. I even started to feel that I was too sinful to be used by God. But God is faithful to His call on our lives. He knows how to wait for us.

It was seventeen years after I stood in

Sunday School and declared in my heart, "I ain't going to preach for nobody," that I remembered saying those words. God was calling me to preach His Word. I argued, but to no avail. He was persistent. I reminded God of all the baggage I would bring to this sacred office. His response to me was, "Preach My Word." I gave the excuse that no one, especially those who really knew me, would believe that I could be a preacher! God once again said, "Preach My Word." I submitted, "Yes, Lord, I will preach Your Word."

I told my wife, Juanita, about my call to preach and she seemed happy. Perhaps she was more relieved than anything because she knew I had been running from a real commitment to serve God. However, being the wife of a preacher was not in her thinking, nor mine, when we were married about five years earlier. I'm glad she decided to stick with me in my preaching.

As I developed in preaching, I would do the things that other preachers would do; I would say the kinds of things other preachers would say. I never knew how to develop the proper relationship with God that I needed. Neither did I know how to deal with God's people as I ought.

When I was called to pastor a church in Peru, Indiana, the first two years were great. We did a good work in rebuilding the church house, but I did little to rebuild the spiritual church. I did not know how to build up the lives of God's people. I had no counseling skills. After five years of work there, I resigned. I had

led them as far as I could. I told the church they needed to get someone they were willing to follow. At the time, I felt the problems between the church and myself were all their fault. But now I know that I was unprepared to pastor a church. I was self taught, except for a few seminars and classes I would attend from time to time. For the most part I had very little formal training.

In 1990, I enrolled in Summit Christian College. I was out of the job I had held for nearly I5 years. I had a wife and five of our six sons were at home. Yet, I enrolled in a Christian college. I did it because God made it clear to me that this was His will for my life. I trusted God's wisdom and obeyed Him. God used His people to encourage me and my family during my college years. Gifts, prayers, scholarships, financial aid and student loans helped me and my family make it through. I thank God for those who helped us.

God truly blesses the obedient. I graduated with honors in Pastoral Ministries in December 1993, and I now pastor the Good Shepherd Community Church in Fort Wayne. I also serve as administrative assistant at Adams and Abbett El-

ementary Schools where I have the opportunity to counsel with young children and their parents.

I am now better equipped to preach and minister to the needs of God's people and my community. I want to put to full use the training I have received because of the gifts of caring people and the commitment of a Christian university like Taylor University.

PARENTS' ASSOCIATION

The TUFW Parents' Association is alive and well as a result of many parents taking an active part.

The purpose of the Parents' Association is to foster and cultivate the spirit of a continuing Christian community of Taylor parents; to unite that community into roles of influence, support and action; and to have a strong voice in sustaining the spiritual welfare of the University.

The Association is governed by the Parents' Cabinet. Nine to twelve family units, representative of each class and geographical location, make up the Cabinet; led this year by Ron and Gretchen Eickhorst.

Generously, the Parents' Cabinet of the Upland campus gave TUFW \$1500 to establish a Students' Emergency Assistance Fund. UPLAND UPDATE

COMMUNICATION ARTS CENTER DEDICATED

The Rupp Communication Arts Center was the site of dedication and ribbon cutting ceremonies Friday, October 14.





ALUMNI PROFILE

PROVISION BEYOND EXPECTATION

Graham West and Lori Fazio came to Fort Wayne Bible College in 1982 for different reasons, each left with a new spiritual maturity resulting from their Fort Wayne experience. In their words:

Lori: "I was hungry to be around Christians. I attended FWBC for two years and my experience reshaped my thinking and helped me to be spiritually focused. Spiritual Emphasis, Elisabeth Elliott's visit, exposure to missionaries and updates on world needs all worked together to make me a stronger Christian."

Graham: "I came to FWBC to play soccer and to become more knowledgeable about the scriptures. . .in that order! When I started college, my life was in limbo and as a result, I had many struggles. Soccer was a big part of my life and I started experiencing personal and spiritual growth through the help and guidance of my teammates and especially from my soccer coach, Denny Williams. As I matured, so did my priorities. I started appreciating the professors. They were committed, steady, and went beyond the requirements."

During their time together at FWBC, Graham and Lori were the "best of friends." Lori shares,

"I was on yearbook staff and was assigned to take the soccer team photo and that is when I met Graham for the first time. I suffered a knee injury while playing basketball a short time after we first met and Graham came to visit me to see how I was doing. From then on we grew to be best of friends!"

Not until after graduation in 1988 (Graham from FWBC and Lori from Warren Wilson College) did they become more than friends. They married in 1990.

While on the Fort Wayne campus, Graham became familiar with Missionary Athletes International, a Christian organization that uses soccer as an evangelistic tool both in the States and overseas. He travelled with the group for three summers. In 1991, while Graham was on his fourth MAI overseas trip, the

Lord did a great work during a very difficult time.

Graham's foot was broken (not good for someone who was playing soccer for a living), Lori was to go on the MAI tour, but did not feel a peace about it so she stayed at home. Their savings was dwindling and Lori had to move from their apartment while Graham was gone. Although they were separated by thousands of miles, God spoke the same message to both of them.

Graham: "While I was in Russia, I saw God work in miraculous ways. So many were accepting Christ as Savior. God instilled in me what was really important: being obedient to Him and proclaiming the Good News."

Lori: "God spoke to me during my alone times with Him. He helped me to see that what was important in life was my willingness to use my skills as His servant, to be faithful and to be obedient."

God honored their obedience. Soon after Graham returned home, he learned that MAI was wanting to open an office in Charlotte, North Carolina, two hours

from their home. Graham enjoyed his experiences with MAI and really felt God's leading to work with the organization full-time.

While the details were being worked out to have MAI in Charlotte, Graham and Lori were preparing to tour together with MAI. Just before leaving for the tour in the summer of 1992, they were told that they had been accepted on staff, full-time, with MAI in Charlotte. Needless to say their spirits were high and they were rejoicing throughout the tour!

The next few months were spent raising support and moving to Charlotte. Since that time their MAI ministry has blossomed. Graham plays on MAI's professional soccerteam, the Charlotte Eagles. The Eagles not only participate in the U.S. Interregional Soccer League, but they also minister through camps, international tours, amateur teams and other ministries here and abroad.

In addition to playing professional soccer, Graham has served as MAI's Charlotte Program and Local Camp Director. He currently serves as the International Tour Coordinator and Women's Tour Director. Lori serves beside Graham as his assistant and co-director of women's ministries.

Graham and Lori readily admit that life can get hectic, especially between April and August, with games, camps, overseas tours, school programs and speaking engagements. But God's blessings keep them going. God has provided far above their expectations. Their overseas experiences have blessed and humbled them. Seeing the sad faces of Russian orphans soften as they hear the message of Jesus has been a priceless experience.

Looking ahead, Graham and Lori share,

"We don't know if life can get any more exciting than what it is! God has taken us beyond our dreams. The Lord will continue to lead and direct, but we know by experience that the greatest excitement in life is being where God wants us to be!"
