It certainly was a different kind of year for the men's soccer team. With only four returning players from last year's team, it is an understatement to say that the team lacked experience. Coach Bob Hamilton said the lack of experience did not hurt the team like it could have. The players had the desire to learn the game and the desire to play.

The team was lead by returning seniors Jose Sanchez and Paul Kellogg and juniors Matt Thebarger and Mike Collins. Also joining the team were seniors Anthony Chapman, Bo Holden, Andy Mays, junior Chris Thompson, and sophomore Marc Murnane all of whom had never played before.

The team started slow, managing only a tie in their first six games, but picked up their play in the second half of the season. They finished the season by winning three of their last four games and ended with a final record of 7-12-1.

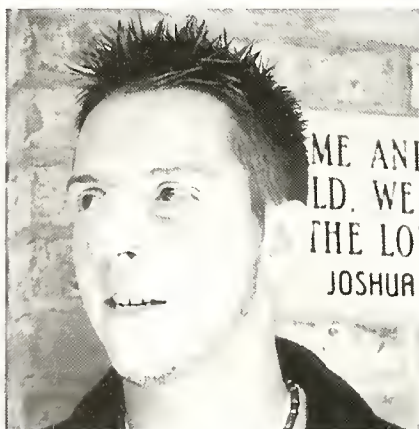

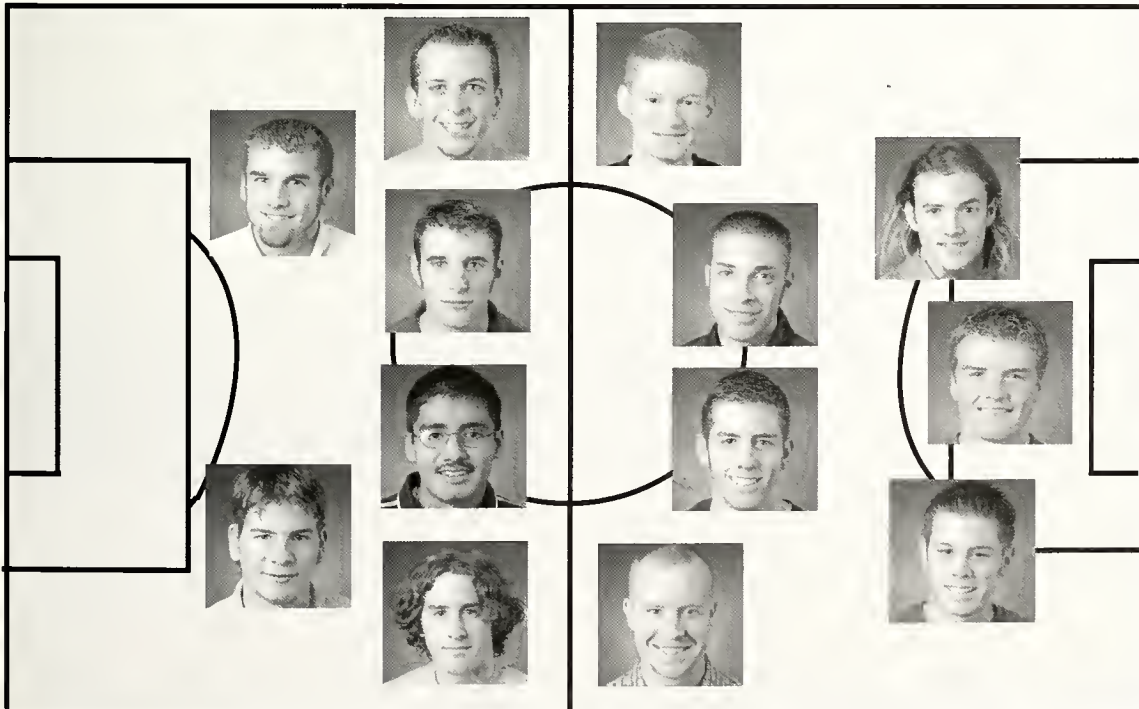

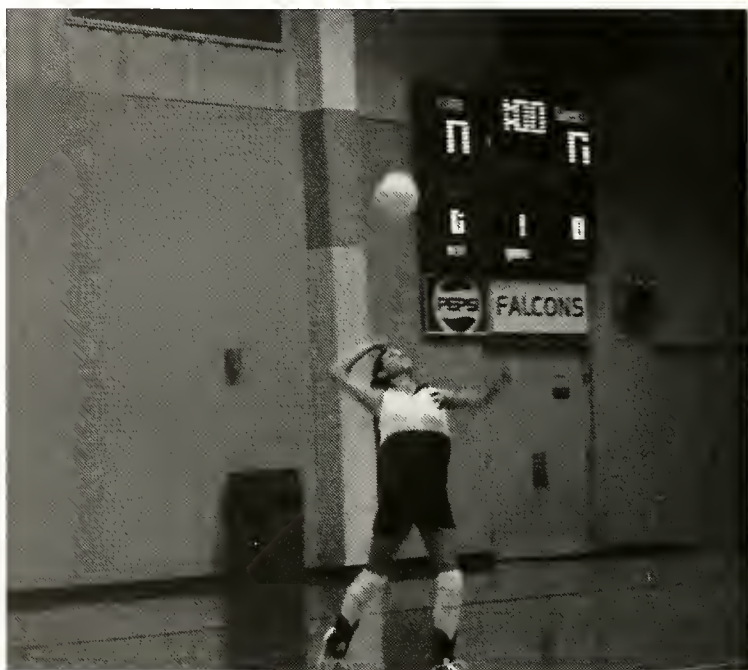

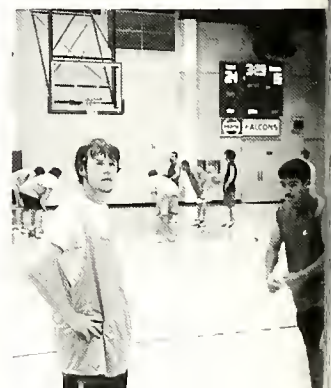

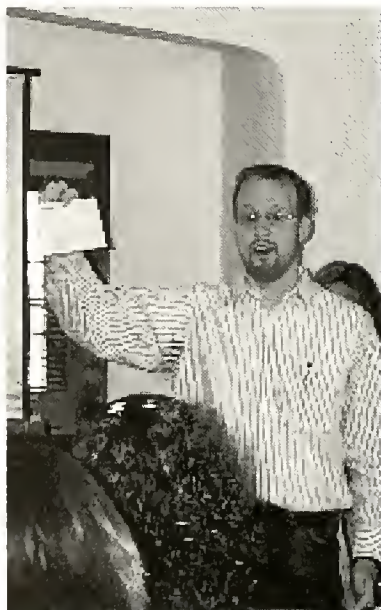
Faculty SPOTLIGHT

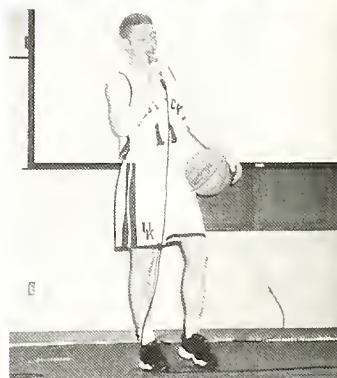
This is the story of Mr. TUFW 2002. . .
