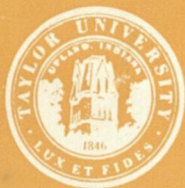

## Christian Leaders Head 3-Day Program



### Homecoming Worship Service

Eugene L. Smith will bring the first Homecoming Worship Service sermon. It is our belief that a time should be set aside at Homecoming for a worship service, as well as for many of the other activities. The Alumni Secretary has been very fortunate in securing Eugene L. Smith, Executive Secretary of the Division of Foreign Missions, of the Board of Missions and Church Extension of the Methodist Church. Dr. Smith has an A.B. degree from Willamette University, a B.D. from Drew Seminary and a Ph.D. from New York University. He is an ordained minister of the Methodist church and has served as pastor for eleven years. Following this period in the pastorate, he went to New York University. In 1949, he accepted the position of Executive Secretary of the Division of Foreign Missions of the Methodist Church.

Dr. Smith was a member of the Phi Delta Kappa and has written several books. His latest, *The Power Within Us*, was published in 1948.

### Inaugural Speaker

Samuel L. Hamilton, Chairman of the Board of Religious Education, School of Education at New York University, for the past 23 years, will bring the featured address at the inauguration on the topic "The Christian College in the Crisis Era."

Professor Hamilton received his A.B. degree from Princeton, his B.D. from Drew Seminary, and has completed graduate work at Columbia and New York Universities. Professor Hamilton began his professional career as pastor of Stony Brook Methodist Church, at which time he was general secretary of the New Jersey Council of Religious Education. Following this office which he held for five years, he assumed his duties at the New York office.

Mr. Hamilton is a member of several organizations. He belongs to the International Council of Religious Education, and is a member of the General Committee of the Federated Council of the Church of Christ in America. In New York City, he is chairman of the committee of Research and the Committee on Parent Education. He also is chairman of the Greater New York Federation of Churches.

### PRESIDENT EVAN H. BERGWALL



President Evan H. Bergwall, Taylor's 16th President, assumed his administrative obligations on September 1, 1951. The President was born on September 16, 1915, in Jamestown, New York, of Scandinavian parentage. Mr. Bergwall has three brothers, and one sister, all of whom are living. His brother, Dr. Warren Bergwall, has indicated Evan's realization of God came at an early age, and he was often discovered preaching to his playmates.

Before coming to Taylor in 1935, President Bergwall was active in church, Sunday school, and Y.M.C.A. work. In fact, Mr. Roy Wagner, Director of the Boys Division of the Y.M.C.A., Jamestown, New York, led Evan to an experience with the Lord while they were talking together in his automobile.

President Bergwall graduated from Taylor with magna cum laude honors, first in his class. Yale University awarded him a Bachelor of Divinity degree in 1943. He was also awarded the Tew prize in literature, the Julia Archibald high scholarship award and the Day fellowship while studying at Yale. President Bergwall has completed graduate work at Yale, New York U., Emory U. and Oxford U. in England.

While serving a student pastorate in Ansonia, Conn., in 1941, he married Mrs. Bergwall, the former Miss Jean Francis. The President's family now consists of two boys, Evan Jr., who is 9 years old, and David, age 6.

After serving churches in the east for nine years, President Bergwall returned to Indiana, where he served in Muncie for one year, and Kendallville, for two and one-half years.

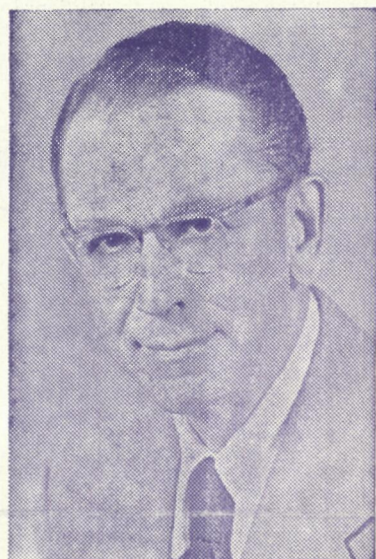

## Banquet Speaker

Dr. Phillips Brooks Smith, will be the featured speaker at the Homecoming Banquet to be held in Maytag Gymnasium, Saturday evening, October 18, at 6:00.

Dr. Smith has an A.B. degree and a D.D. degree from Taylor University, an A.M. from Earlham College, and has also studied at Indiana University. For several years he was a member of the North Indiana Conference of the Methodist Church. He served charges at Anderson, Yorktown, Windfall, and Bluffton. From 1937 to 1941, he was district superintendent of the Richmond district. In 1941, he became pastor at the First Methodist Church in Hammond, Indiana, and transferred his conference membership to the Northwest Indiana Conference. For the past three years he has served as superintendent of the South Bend district of that conference.

Dr. Smith, who is probably better known as "P. B." to many, is a member of the board of trustees of Kendall College, and chairman of the Commission on World Service and Finance of the Methodist Church. Those who can attend will be captivated by his wit and humor, and inspired by his spiritual observations.

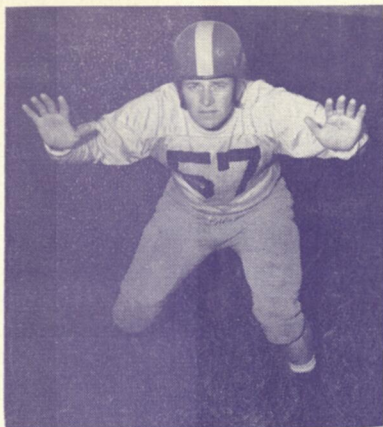

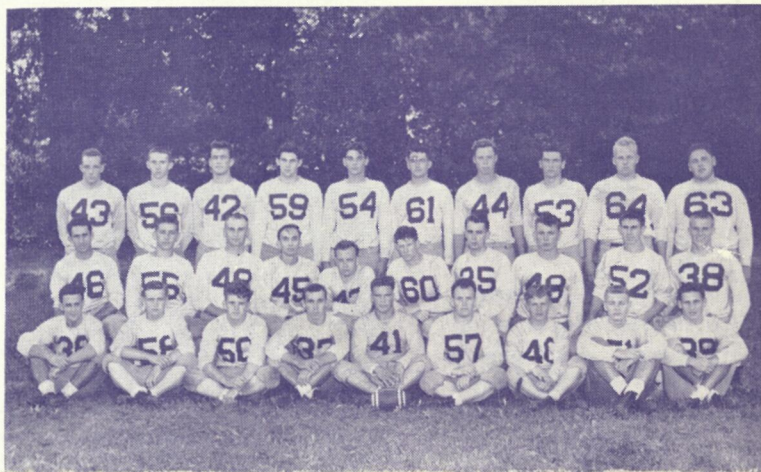
## Taylor on New Bus Route from Chicago
