BUILDING FUND DRIVE LAUNCHED FOR FORT WAYNE AREA: GOAL SET

The Fort Wayne area fund drive for the Fiftieth Anniversary building project was launched November 16 at a dinner meeting with about fifty laymen and pastors as district workers in attendance. The goal for the Fort Wayne area was set at \$250,000—one third of the total project, which includes construction of a new administrative-educational building and a library. Similar fund drives in other areas are expected to bring in the remaining \$500,000.

At the meeting, each worker selected about a dozen contact cards from a collection of over 700, each bearing the name of a prospective donor. The workers, divided into teams—each with a captain, met again on November 30 for a preliminary re-

port. A final report meeting will be held about the middle of this month.

Team captains for the Fort Wayne drive are Rev. Walter H. Lugibihl, team 1; Rev. C. B. Vollmar, team 2; Royle Sprunger, team 3; Arthur Dit-mer, team 4; Richard Gerig, team 5; Howard Von Gunten, team 6; D. Marion Lochner, team 7; Clarence Greider, team 8; Rev. Cyril Eicher, team 9; and Ben Hartman, team 10. Several members of the building committee also attended the meeting.

Dr. S. A. Witmer, president and chairman of the project, told the group that the present expansion program, in terms of resources and constituency, is not as large an undertaking as the erection of one building by the school's founders fifty years ago. Construction of the new buildings will begin on the south campus as soon as 75 percent of the total cost has been met by either cash or pledges.

A unique feature of the program will be choral speaking by the choir,' using portions of Luke 2, and interspersed with two carols to be sung by the congregation.

God Bless Our Laymen

Fort Wayne Bible College in its fiftieth anniversary owes all of its blessings—past and present—to God Himself. Under God it owes much to human instrumentalities—founders, teachers, alumni. But one class of human instruments deserves special mention at this time—Christian laymen. Their work is usually done behind the scenes and therefore is seldom recognized.

The school was founded principally by ordained ministers, but with later growth, laymen came more and more into positions of responsibility. Today several laymen on the Governing Board have longer terms of service than any member of the faculty with but one exception. Mr. S. A. Lehman, Fort Wayne industrialist, has been serving continuously as a trustee for 25 years; Mr. J. Francis Chase, commercial artist of Chicago, for 17 years; Mr. L. Shirl Hatfield, Pandora, Ohio, banker, for 16 years. The college owes much to the mature judgment, the business insight, the administrative know-how, the wise foresight, and the spiritual concern of the laymen who have served and are serving on its Governing Board. Others have given invaluable help on building committees. Many have supported the college by their gifts.

But the anniversary year is witnessing a new and significant advance in terms of lay participation and responsibility. For the first time in its 50-year history, a corps of 60 some workers—mostly laymen—is organized to do an important job for the college. That number of men in Fort Wayne are beginning to campaign for funds for the anniversary building project. We trust that it will not only be a God-blessed event but that it will set the pattern for similar participation by laymen in other areas.

Responsibility by laymen is one hundred per cent right and scriptural.

The gifts and talents of ALL Christians are to be employed in the service of Christ. "Helps" and "governments" are divinely appointed services as well as the work of apostles and teachers according to Romans 12:28.

Christian education is a task of such dimensions that it requires the active support of everyone.

The challenge of greatly expanding enrollments in the years ahead calls for the mobilization of Christian people and their means in a much greater degree than heretofore.

Fort Wayne Bible College needs and appreciates the backing of laymen. May God bless each one.
